

Summer Reading for Rising 4th Graders

The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe

****This is due by Friday of the first week of school. All sentences should be complete. All sentences should include descriptive nouns, adjectives, and verbs. All sentences should use correct grammar, punctuation, capitalization, and spelling. This can be hand-written or typed. It would be best to cut out the templates we are providing, color them, and write the required information for each item on the back of the corresponding template. You could even write the required information for each piece on notebook paper and attach that to the back of the colored templates.**

1. On the wardrobe, write your name, the title, and the author of the book. Include an illustration or a design.
2. On the first coat, write a 6-10 sentence description of the settings of the book. Setting includes the time and place a story happens.
3. On the second coat, write a 2-3 sentence paragraph about each of the main characters. Include names, ages (approximate guess if not stated in the book), physical appearance, and personality traits.
4. On the third coat, write a summary of the book. Use complete sentences and correct punctuation.
5. On the fourth coat, write a 6-10 sentence paragraph telling about the climax of the book. The climax is the most exciting part of the book and is usually toward the end of the book.
6. On the fifth coat, write a 6-10 sentence paragraph telling about 5 important plot events.
7. On the sixth coat, write a 6-10 sentence paragraph describing the problem and resolution (how a problem is solved) of the book. Focus on the biggest problem the characters faced and how they overcame that problem.
8. On the lamppost page, draw a favorite scene from the book. Include one sentence describing your scene. Color your picture.
